
Enjoy the summer, I am looking forward to the fall and cooler weather. And stay at home. We have visited 13 states driving in one month.





Harvey's parents had retired to Pine Harbor, Georgia. There house was upstream on the narrow part of the Sapelo River before it expands into the sound. Their invitation to Harvey for this visit happily included me and my boat. We trailered down in the afternoon and put the Poseidon in the water at Mr. Harrad's commercial dock the next morning.




Shrimp boat on Sapelo Sound

At one point, when we were in the sound, a porpoise came right up to the boat. This was all heady stuff for a Tennessee hillbilly! When we returned we bypassed Mr. Harrad's marina and tied up at a residential dock upstream. The next day Harvey and I stopped for fuel and ice before we returned to the sound. Mr. Harrad gave us holy hell for not letting him know we had returned safely the day before. It was gratifying to see his concern and that he had not forgotten us.

Harvey and I made a great day of exploring the sound. Toward the end of the day, we cruised south along a tidal creek on the west side of Black Beard Island. Yes, the famous pirate is supposed to have also visited here. The island is now a National Wildlife Refuge. At the south end of the island we went out through Cabretta Inlet into the surf and into the Atlantic. We then cruised north about seven miles along the east side of Black Beard Island back to the entrance of Sapelo Sound.






Where Is My Carter Craft Hull Number?

Information I was provided says they were on left side of dash, but had to be visible from seat.




Where Is My Carter Boat Hull Number? Carter Boats
