





ee America In A Carter C

My name is Don Hixson and I live in Ooltewah, Tennessee. I am the former owner of a Carter Craft Sea Hawk, hull number 5663, built in 1957, the year I graduated from high school. I have recently sold the boat, motor, and trailer as I am getting too disabled to use it or take care of it. It is my hope the new owner will enjoy it as I did. I made several trips of some duration with the boat. Rick asked me if I could write some of them up. I have four of them, the first being as follows:



The River Below Chattanooga Is Considered To Be The "Grand Canyon Of Tennessee



CHATTANNOOGA TO MEMPHIS June 1967

My father and I put the boat in the water below Chickamauga Dam on a Saturday morning. This dam is just a few miles upstream of Chattanooga. We cruised down the 470 miles of the Tennessee River to Paducah, Kentucky, where we entered the Ohio River. From there we cruised down 50 miles entering the Mississippi at Cairo, Illinois. We spent two days and traveled two hundred and thirty miles on the Mississippi. We spent Thursday night at a fisherman boat dock at New Madrid, Missouri. On Friday afternoon we docked at the marina on McKellar Lake for a total trip of about 750 water miles. McKellar Lake is a body of water just below Memphis that connects with the Mississippi River. The gasoline cost for the entire trip was \$49. We slept and ate on the boat except for one night and that was at Paducah. We decided it was time for a restaurant and creature comforts, plus it was raining. When we arrived at Memphis we spent the night there.

Chattanooga To Memphis – Part 1

Dad and I flew back to Chattanooga the next morning. It was the first time my father had been on a jet aircraft, he marveled that what took us by water all week we did by air in 45 minutes. The next weekend I drove over to Memphis and trailered the boat back home.

The Tennessee River has only short stretches that could be considered riverine. It is now a series of reservoirs (lakes) formed by dams with locks. Consequently there is very little current, except just below each dam. Our trip took us through seven locks with a total of a little over three hundred feet of drop in elevation. At the time, the construction of Nickajack dam had just been finished, but the reservoir behind it was not yet filled with water. Thus the old Hales Bar Dam just upstream was still in operation and so we had to lock through it. Today Hales Bar Dam is no more. The old powerhouse is used as a marina. The Tennessee River begins at Knoxville in the northern part of east Tennessee, flows south past Chattanooga and enters Alabama at Bridgeport.

This city is important in Civil War history and was the site of paddle-wheel steamer construction in the 1800's. The river continues south to just beyond Huntsville, Alabama, where it turns west, crosses Alabama, touches a corner of Mississippi and then heads back pretty much straight north crossing Tennessee and Kentucky.

By contrast the Ohio and the Mississippi have plenty of current. We were impressed by this and also by the size of the barge tows on the Mississippi. Three to four times the number of barges you would see in a tow on our Tennessee River system. There were two dams with locks on the section of the Ohio River that we traversed. I assumed this would be a similar process to what we had already done so many times. But it was a whole different situation that I was to learn about with chagrin and relief.

Chattanooga To Memphis - Part 1

The purpose of these dams is to hold back water in times of low river flows to permit boat and barge traffic. When the river flow is high they are not needed and the dams are ingeniously lowered to the river bed. The lock is non-functional at this time. I had noticed these dams on my river charts. I will close on this as a bit of humor. When I asked the dock master at the Paducah marina about them, he said, " Oh, don't worry about those dams, at this high river flow you will go right over them."






