





### Augusta, Georgía To Myrtle Beach - Part 3

May 1968

Augusta, Georgia to Myrtle Beach, South Carolina Via Savannah River and the Intracoastal Waterway

I guess I was attracted to the Savannah River because we fished there when I was a teenager. We lived in Barnwell, SC at the time. In about 1952, my father had taken a construction job at the AEC Savannah River Project. The site, now regulated by the Dept. of Energy, occupies several miles along the east bank of the river.

I began my solo trip at Savannah Bluff Lock and Dam which is just downstream of Augusta. The lock master there kindly agreed to let me leave my car and trailer at his house for safe keeping. It is about 180 miles from here to the city of Savannah which is about twice the straight line distance. The river has several bends where it almost loops back on itself. Some of these "ox bows" have been cut across the loop allowing the river to go straight through. This has come about either by the action of nature or in some cases the Corps of Engineers. I anchored in one of these former ox bows for the pleasant evening I spent on the river. Blue Springs is very picturesque settlement of cabins and docks . I stopped there for fuel and to explore.



#### Augusta, Georgía To Myrtle Beach - Part 3

**May 1968**

The next day I cruised past the city of Savannah and picked up the Intracoastal Waterway. I arrived at Hilton Head Marina in the late afternoon and spent the evening there. I don't know why this sticks with me but I especially remember being stretched out in the cuddy cabin reading a book. It was a pleasant evening and there was a breeze blowing and gently rocking my boat.

The next morning I crossed Port Royal Sound and learned the importance and convenience of running a compass course. Although you can see across these large bodies of water, it is difficult or impossible to distinguish exact landmarks. I stopped briefly at Beaufort, SC. That afternoon I arrived at Charleston, SC municipal marina and spent the night there. The next morning I asked about visiting Fort Sumter but discouraged about doing that. I was told that there was not a good place to dock a small boat there. They suggested I might cruise up the Cooper River to see the naval base which I did. I guess I over did my visit as I was told by naval personnel that I was in a restricted area and should leave. At this time, the nuclear submarine Thresher had disappeared. No doubt the US Navy was more uptight than usual.

### Augusta, Georgía To Myrtle Beach - Part 3

**May 1968**

The next evening was spent at Georgetown, SC on beautiful Winyah Bay. The next day finished my trip as I arrived at Myrtle Beach, SC. The ICW is about three miles inland of the city. I remember it was only a short drive from the marina to the beach and also to the airport. The marina operator asked that since I was not planning to go back out for that day, would it be OK to dock a large boat at my stern. This was no problem. A friend of mine, when he saw the slides of my trip, said "Don, there is more wood in one of the hatch covers of that yacht than there is in your entire boat". This was probably true!

In conclusion, I flew back from Myrtle Beach to Augusta and spent the night at the airport hotel there. The airport, Bush Field, is in almost walking distance of the lock and dam. The airport shuttle service made a short detour on their route and dropped me off at the lock masters house. I picked up my car and trailer, thanked everyone profusely, promised I would send slides of my adventure which I did. Next was the drive to Myrtle Beach, load up the Poseidon, and drive back home.



Hickey provided Jim dimensional drawing of Original Carter Craft wrap around windshield for Sea Hawk. I have provided a template for Sea Lark.








### Where Is My Carter Craft Hull Number?

Information I was provided says they were on left side of dash, but had to be visible from seat.




# Where Is My Carter Boat Hull Number? Carter Boats
