

FISHING BOAT TO RUNABOUT CONVERSION IN THE SPIRIT OF CARTER CRAFT BOATS:

BACKGROUND:

After parting with my Carter Craft "Sea Hawk", I had a desire to own another runabout boat. I have had this idea in mind for several years and started the project planning during the early winter months of 2016. Worked on it all summer of 2016 off and on. I used the construction design used in my Sea Hawk front bow and finished all but the windshield in 2016. I designed and worked on the windshield this last winter and installed it this Summer. My plan was to be able to convert a 14' Aluma Craft fishing boat into a small runabout in 6-8 hours time.

Completed runabout with CC style windshield completed in October 2017. The front bow pendent has the Carter Craft script embroidered on it. For motor controls I used an old 50's style Johnson shift and throttle control. I developed a method of controlling the tiller handle throttle speed using the Johnson control.

Completed dash and deck with vintage steering wheel. I made a mockup of the front deck and dash making sure everything would work.




Is your windshield cracked or broken? These are the next items to work.

I am in discussions with a shop in West palm Beach to produce windshields. We need to know how many we could expect to order to get pricing. Please advise to Rick Pressley if you are interested.

Jim Hickey provided а dimensional drawing of Original Carter Craft Porthole Frames. took those dimensions and created a 3D CAD model to be used for printing a mold. A shaded image was generated and we have received the first quotes for producing parts. This will be a one run and parts will be built on for those purchasing. No extras will be made.

We have quotes that put this at \$50.00 to \$37.50 each depending on quantity. We need 120 to hit the 37.50. We are making these available at cost. If you are interested, please email me with the qty you desire. I would suggest buying sets, as these will not likely match older plastics that have yellowed. If this is well received, we will consider other parts in the future.


